Ensuring Social Value

As part of our commitment to deliver social value, reducing our overhead costs is key to ensuring we can invest as much as possible into our services.

One example last year was when we commenced the next phase of our paperless strategy by launching CARAS Mobile.



CARAS Mobile


CARAS is the software system that we use to record all of our client and staff activities. We have now issued our Carer Support Workers (CSWs) with a mobile phone loaded with the CARAS app. The new system has helped to reduce the amount of paper documents we now need to issue. The system also makes our Carer Support Workers more self-sufficient thereby reducing the number of phone calls/visits they need to make to the office.



What can CSWs do on CARAS mobile:

- · Access their work rotas
- Record when they arrive and leave
- Make notes about their visit
- · Access client details when needed
- Read and send messages to/from the office



Improving Social Skills

Helping children and adults with Autism and their carers across Cheshire continues to be a service that we are dedicated to deliver. Last year we hosted 84 speech and language therapy (SLT) sessions, followed by 84 social outings to enable attendees to practise their new found skills in a fun, safe and relaxed environment.

Short Breaks

Carers Trust 4all provide a range of services for children with complex needs and disabilities. The sessions we offer allow them to try new activities, make new friends and build more confidence.

We offer:

- Weekend short breaks
- Weekend residential trips
- Activity4all
- Social skills for Autism



Support for parent carers, children and young people

Activity breaks provide much needed respite for parent carers, safe in the knowledge that their child is being cared for by skilled staff in a risk free environment whilst having lots of fun!

In addition, we also provide care in the home to allow parents to take a break to catch up on tasks, spend time with their other children or simply have a rest.



End of Life Care

End of life care is a highly valued service that continues to be a key area of work for Carers Trust 4all.

It enables individuals to die at home, if that is their preferred place of death, and supports keeping families together.



Working in Partnership



We work in partnership with a number of Clinical Commissioning Groups to deliver these specialist services including; South and Eastern Cheshire, Vale Royal, Liverpool (in partnership with Marie Curie) and Warrington.



Our Story in Numbers

Funding at Carers Trust 4all comes from a variety of different sources including donations, charitable trusts, contracts and legacies. Services are supported by a range of funders, enabling us to deliver support to thousands of carers of all ages. We work hard to ensure as many services as possible are free at the point of delivery and will continue to do so. We accept donations from far and wide, whether you make a regular or one off donation, or take part in an organised event or even create your own fundraising activity, every penny really does help.



Results for 2017/2018

In the year to 31 March 2018, our total income was £3,917,307 and our total expenditure was £3,893,358 resulting in a surplus of £23,950. All of the surplus will be re-invested in providing services to carers. At 31 March 2018 our total funds were £777,368 of which £87,674 were restricted funds, given for a specific purpose. We expect the next financial year to be challenging, however we have good reserves and strong bank balances so we face the future with confidence.
