Welcome to Carers Trust 4all, Herefordshire CarerLinks very first Newsletter!

CarerLinks was commissioned by Herefordshire Council on 1 April 2019 to provide an information and advice service to support individuals who are new to caring for someone or for existing carers who need additional support.

A team of five Carer Advisors, Chrissy, Jude, Lauren, Meloney and Michelle are working in the community to identify hidden carers or carers needing support.

CarerLinks can help by:

- ⇒ Supporting carers to think about their own needs and plan action for change
- ⇒ Listening and offering a range of services and support to help carers improve their health and wellbeing, including; 1:1 support, information, advice, advocacy and signposting
- ⇒ Working in partnership to link carers with all other sources of help and support

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Could you volunteer?

Volunteering offers vital help to charities, worthwhile causes and the community, but the benefits can be even greater for the volunteer.

What do we offer volunteers?

- A first-class induction, training and support
- A reference to future prospective employers

Grants available to support carers

As a Network Partner of Carers Trust we have access to grant funding 'Carers Funds'. The grant programme is open to carers aged 16 and over. Carers can apply for grants of up to £300 for items or activities that will benefit them in their caring role e.g:

- Breaks for carers, with or without the person they care for
- Items for the home including cookers, fridges, beds, etc
- Courses and materials to develop carers skills or hobbies
- Home repairs
- Short term or time limited replacement care

The Jointly App requires a one off payment of £2.99 to sign up and that allows you to invite as many joint users as needed for the person you care for. Elsie's Story



Elsie cares for her husband who has Alzheimer's.

Elsie was referred to CarerLinks as she was feeling isolated and needed time for herself. She also felt low and was finding her caring role hard at times.

Carer Advisor Michelle linked Elsie to a

carer led Carers Support Group in her local community along with a Creative Carers Group that runs monthly as Elsie enjoys doing crafts, crocheting and knitting. Elsie now regularly meets with one of the carers from the group for a coffee and chat.

Elsie expressed her appreciation of being able to talk with a Carer Advisor and that she felt reassured that if she requires any further information or advice that she can make contact and has the contact details for the Support Line - 01432 663057

Emergency Planning - Message in a bottle

Data Link is more commonly known as the 'message in the bottle' scheme. It's a simple way of ensuring that if ambulance, police or fire crews have to attend the property, essential information is readily available, which can save vital minutes and ensure the correct actions are taken in an emergency.



How does it work? A canister has a form inside which you fill in with the relevant information. Medication information can be completed in pencil in case it changes, or a repeat prescription can be inserted into the canister. The canister is sealed and put in the fridge.

Carers Timebank

Timebanking unlocks unused time, skills and care, allowing carers to live as independently as possible. Although facilitated by a CarerLinks coordinator, this is very much a carer led initiative.

Carers will be supported to join the timebank and will discuss what they can offer e.g. befriending, dogwalking, errands and what they would like to access e.g gardening, DIY...etc.

All skills and contributions are valued equally. Each time swap is recorded to ensure a fair and equal process. Weekly social meetings will provide the opportunity for participants to meet up and try new activities as a group.
